Alleluia! Christ is risen!

Dear Friends, what a joy it is to proclaim together the heart of our faith: Jesus is alive! The stone is rolled away, the tomb is empty, and death has been defeated. This is not just good news — it is the best news.

The story of Mary Magdalene goes to the tomb early in the morning, still in the shadow of grief. But what she finds is not what she expects. The stone is rolled away. The body is gone. Confusion leads to wonder, and soon enough, to belief. Peter and the beloved disciple run to the tomb. We can almost feel the turning point in that moment: something new has begun. A new creation. 
