The Pastor's Desk. "Pray always and never lose heart." (Luke 18:1)

My dear friends, the readings of this weekend speak deeply to our experience as people of faith who sometimes feel tired, discouraged, or tempted to give up—especially when our prayers seem unanswered.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the parable of the persistent widow who keeps returning to the judge until she receives justice. Her perseverance reminds us that prayer is not just about asking more often—it is about remaining steadfast in faith and trust, even when God seems silent.

The first reading gives us a powerful image: Moses, weary in prayer, keeps his arms raised as Israel battles Amalek. When he grows tired, Aaron and Hur stand beside him and hold his arms up. Victory comes through persistence—and through the support of others.

St. Paul, writing to Timothy, reminds us that Scripture equips and strengthens us for every good work. God's Word becomes our light when we are tempted to lose hope.

Today's message is clear: Persist in prayer, even when answers delay, Support and strengthen one another in faith and Trust in God's justice and timing.

Let us try to be a people who persevere in our prayers even when it's hard, without forgetting that God who hears every cry will, in His time, act with justice and love.
