(Luke 18:14)

Dear friends,

This weekend's readings remind us that God does not listen to proud words or look at appearances. He listens to a humble heart.

In the first reading from Sirach, we hear that "the prayer of the humble pierces the clouds." God is close to those who come to Him with honesty and trust, especially the poor and those who suffer. The Psalm also says, "The Lord hears the cry of the poor."

St. Paul, at the end of his life, looks back and says, "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." He knows that it was God's strength—not his own—that helped him to be faithful.

In the Gospel, Jesus tells the story of the Pharisee and the tax collector. The Pharisee brags about his good works, while the tax collector humbly prays, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Jesus says that the humble man went home right with God.
